March 11, 2025

The Russell City Council held their regular meeting on Tuesday March 11th in the City Hall meeting room at 5:30 pm. Present at the meeting were council members Hilary Buchert, Glen Grant, Matt Kerkaert and Dawn Garbe. Also present were Laurie Millner, City clerk, Jason Alberts, Public works director, Shelly Sanow, RBG lead bartender, Lyon County Sheriff Eric Wallen, Matt Gross, City attor-

ney, and members of the community.

The meeting was called to order with the pledge of allegiance by Mayor Buchert.

M/S/C Glen / Dawn to approve the agenda as presented.

M/S/C Dawn / Hilary to approve the minutes from the February 11th regular meeting.

M/S/C Glen / Dawn to set a public hearing for April 8th at 5:30 pm to discuss the project and how the

SCDP grant funds will be utilized.

M/S/C Matt/ Glen to approve Resolution 2025-3 A Resolution adopting the Lyon County 2024 Hazard Mitigation plan.

The council instructed the clerk to work with Southwest Sanitation to set a date for City Wide clean up. The council also instructed the clerk to work with Marshall Animal Clinic to set up an animal clinic.

M/S/C Matt /Dawn to cash in CD 9412 in the amount of \$53,565.18. Hilary abstained.

M/S/C Glen / Matt to transfer \$15,000 from the Permanent Improvement fund at First Independent

Bank to the checking account to pay the DSI bill for Grant Administration.

One of my memories is learning a wee bit about tariffs during United States history classes in our School on the Hill. As I recall tariffs were initiated to protect fledging industries from foreign competition in the early years of the United States. Sometime later I learned that they were also a primary source of income for our early Federal Government (now greatly surpassed by income taxes...do remember April 15th looms). What I think I know now is that tariffs are import taxes and generally make any imported stuff I buy more expensive. This is because it is not the foreign producer who pays the tariff/tax to our government; it is the importer who pays that tariff/tax to our government. Hence, the increased expense of my imported stuff is where the tariff/tax is ultimately paid. The foregoing makes my head hurt. Further, I don't remember learning much about economics in our venerable school except that it was unwise to try to spend more money than earned. I bring up economics (fondly referred to as the "dismal science" by generations of students) because economists cannot agree on the advantages and or disadvantages of tariffs. All that said, it appears that we, the people will soon know which economists are right (or wrong)... I wish us all good luck. On a somewhat lighter note, some readers will recall that I keep a small flock of chickens on our seven Pennsylvania acres (in memory of farm days past)...we have not bought an egg for many years which has recently been economically rewarding...but don't ask me how much expense has not been spared on the flock...anyway, I recently began to wonder if chickens had a right or left leg preference when scratching for food. Our chickens get some free range time nearly every day, so I set out to do some research. I settled in a chair near a gaggle of hens busy scratching (3 to 5 – hens were frequently distracted/disturbed by an amorous rooster). After about 15 minutes of careful observation I came to the conclusion that chickens do not have a preferred scratching leg. Admittedly, this was a short study with a small sample, thus further research is welcomed. Let me know of conclusions reached. 

Vincent F. Lange of Sioux Falls, South Dakota, passed away on Thursday, March 6, 2025, at Legends on Lake Lorraine Senior Living, surrounded by his family. He was 99 years old.

A service to celebrate his life will be held at 10 am on Friday, April 11, 2025, at Spirit of Joy Lutheran Church in Sioux Falls, with family present at 9 am. There will be a luncheon following the service and an interment of ashes at Hills of Rest Cemetery in Sioux Falls.

Vincent Ferdinand Lange was born in Curry, MN, on October 11, 1925, to Fred Lange and Ella (Voss) Lange at their farmhouse. He joined an older sister, Evelyn, and a brother, John. The family lived there until Vince was three years old, when they moved to a farm near Osseo, MN. A few years later, the family moved closer to home and began farming near Russell, MN. In 1940, they moved to their own farm near Balaton, MN, where Vince resided for the rest of his life. He attended country schools in the area until the 8th grade, at which time he began helping his father farm the land. He attended catechism classes and was confirmed a member at Sillerud Lutheran Church near their

farm. The family then began attending Grace Lutheran Church in Russell.

At age 20, his father passed away from cancer, and Vince began his lifelong career of farming the family land and taking care of his mother, Ella. They lived together in the farmhouse there until his mother passed away in 1974. They

spent holidays and Sunday afternoons with family members near Slayton, MN, and had many happy times together. Vince also enjoyed spending a few winters in Texas traveling with friends.

In 1975, he met and married Arlene Mary (Reichmuth) Buckmaster from Chokio, MN. Arlene's sister, Marlys, introduced them at a family Fourth of July gathering nearby, and they began dating. He was 50 years old and had always been a bachelor, taking care of his family farm and his mother. But, on April 26th, 1975, he and Arlene were married in Chokio, and he became a loving husband and father to three young children. They traveled to Alexandria, MN, for their honeymoon in a spring blizzard. After their honeymoon, Vince arrived in Chokio in a grain truck to haul Arlene and her three children and household belongings to his farm near Russell.

Vince and Arlene had many happy days together and were married for 49 wonderful years! They farmed together until Vince retired from farming in 1990. They began spending winters in Weslaco, TX, and spent many good winters there with friends doing fun activities. In retirement, they also enjoyed working for 8 years in the South Dakota State Park System, spending most of their summers working in Custer State Park. They continued wintering in Texas for many years. They loved square-dancing together and made many friends traveling to square-dances. They also enjoyed traveling and were able to visit many countries around the world.

Faith was always an important part of Vince's life, and they appreciated their church communities and friends in Russell, MN, Weslaco, TX, and Sioux Falls, SD, at Spirit of Joy Lutheran Church.

In 1999, Vince and Arlene moved to Sioux Falls to be near their daughter and her family. In 2019, the couple moved to Legends on Lake Lorraine Senior Living Center, where they resided until Vince's passing.

Grateful for sharing his life are his two sons, Scott Buckmaster and Bradley Buckmaster, and his daughter, Kristin Snyder (Craig); six grandchildren - Colbie, Jordyn, Ammon (Lisa), Elizabeth (Gabe Messler), Jonah (Alison) and Benjamin and nine great-grandchildren - Gauge, Stella, Scarlett, Lilyjana, Jude, Carolyn, Lucy, Sylvia and Ivy.

He was preceded in death by his wife Arlene, his parents, and his sister and brother.
