

Russell City Council meeting

August 12, 2025

The Russell City Council held their regular meeting on Tuesday August 12th in the City Hall Meeting room at 5:30 pm. Present at the meeting were Mayor Hilary Buchert council members, Glen Grant, Matt Kerkaert, Joel VanDamme, and Dawn Garbe. Also present were Laurie Millner, City clerk, Shelly Sanow, RBG Lead, Darci Anderson, Kinner & Co, Paul Jurek, Bollig Engineering, Lyon County Sheriff Eric Wallen, and members of the community.

Mayor Hilary Buchert called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

M/S/C Glen Grant/ Joel VanDamme to approve the agenda as presented.

M/S/C Matt Kerkaert / Dawn Garbe to approve the minutes of the July 7<sup>th</sup> regular meeting.

M/S/C Joel VanDamme / Glen Grant to approve the minutes of the July 21st Special meeting.

M/S/C Glen Grant / Joel VanDamme to award the bridge project to Prahm Construction Inc., low bidder in the amount of \$1,095,170.35.

M/S/C Glen Grant / Joel VanDamme to approve a service agreement with Silversmith data for asset man-

agement software. The first year's cost is covered by a technical assistance grant for lead service inventory. Linda Escher requested that the portion of Miller Street starting at her driveway to the dead end be vacated. Council instructed Laurie to have the area surveyed. Once that is done, we will schedule a public hearing.

M/S/C Hilary Buchert / Dawn Garbe to purchase six (6) water meters from Ferguson for \$2,100.00

M/S/C Matt Kerkaert / Glen Grant to buy a pallet of cold mix bags to fix potholes.

M/S/C Matt Kerkaert/ Joel VanDamme to move forward with Nuvei for online utility bill payments.

M/S/C Matt Kerkaert / Joel VanDamme to contract with Lake's gas to pre buy propane at \$1.599 per gal-

lon contract for 4335 gallons for a total of \$6,073.27

M/S/C Joel VanDamme / Glen Grant to hold a public hearing on September 9<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 regarding the special use permit for Scott Williams to mine gravel.

M/S/C Glen Grant / Joel VanDamme to hold a public hearing on September 9<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 regarding the special use permit for Ritchie Petersen to graze cows in City limits.

M/S/C Matt Kerkaert / Joel VanDamme to approve the bills as presented.

### Minnesota Memories September 2025....life long learning

Ok, for openers let me assure you that this was not generated by Artificial Intelligence (AI), indeed, some may ponder if intelligence of any type was involved. On occasion google and wikepedia are employed to check on some elusive fact which my stressed memory cannot recall. Generally, however, what you read here is dredged up form youthful memory and what I have read/experienced over many years. The grade school teachers in our old school on the hill, my mother, and my natural inclination combined, serendipitously, to foster my enjoyment of reading, books, and life long learning. In regard to books, and with our country's 250th Birthday coming this next year, I highly recommend Rick Atkinson's The British are Coming and Fate of the Day. ### **Patricia Ann Minett**

July 11, 1936 — August 26, 2025 Russell

Patricia "Patty" Minett, age 89, of Russell, Minnesota, died on Tuesday, August 26, 2025, at Prairie View Senior Living in Tracy, Minnesota. Memorial Services are 2:00 p.m. Friday, September 12, 2025, at the Balaton United Methodist Church. Following a reception for attendees, interment will be in the Russell Cemetery. Visitation will be held just prior to her celebration, from 1:00 – 2:00 p.m. on Friday, September 12, also at the church in Balaton, Minnesota.

Patricia Ann Winders was born on July 11, 1936, in Russell, Minnesota. She was the daughter of Myles and Elsie (Greve) Winders. Patty grew up in Russell where she was baptized in the Christian faith on March 17, 1953, and was later confirmed at the Russell Presbyterian Church. She graduated from Russell High School in 1954 and then moved to Minneapolis where she worked for the next 10 years at the Prudential Insurance Company.

On May 11, 1957, Patty was united in marriage to Marvin Minett in St. Paul, Minnesota. They were married by the same pastor and in the same church where her parents were married in December of 1925! The couple moved back to Marshall area in 1971 when Marv began working in the Minett family well-drilling business. They built their home and settled in Russell. Patty was a homemaker and mother for many years before going to work at Schwan's ice cream plant in 1991. She retired in May of 1999.

Patty was a longtime member of the Presbyterian Church in Russell and had an extensive collection of anything related to owls. In her spare time, she enjoyed doing jigsaw puzzles, bird watching, tracing her family genealogy, watching TV, and above all spending time with her family.

Patricia Minett died on Tuesday, August 26, 2025, in Tracy, Minnesota with family by her side. She reached the age of 89 years, I month, and I5 days. Blessed be her memory.

She is survived by her 3 children, Craig (and Sheila) Minett of Tracy, Lisa Towne of Tracy, Steven (and Jennie) Minett of Balaton; 8 grandchildren, Emily (and Cody) Nelson, Cody Minett, Michaela (and Jeremy) Miller-Schreier, Eric (and Caitlyn) Minett, Trent Minett, Paige Minett, Merci Minett, Connor Towne; 5 great-grandchildren, Jaeda, Hadli, Skylar, Creed, Hayes; nieces, nephews, other relatives, and many friends.

Patty was preceded in death by her parents, Myles & Elsie Winders; husband, Marvin Minett (who died on March 6, 1986), and sister, Arlene (and Bob) Sorensen.
